## New Nights, New Leagues


Behind our growth are many kids playing two (or even three!) games per week.

Previously, pretty much everyone trained once a week, played once a week, and that was it. But we've begun offering opportunities to play a second game per week, and the response has been huge. And feedback is positive, with kids generally loving the extra play time, and coaches reporting that it's delivering developmental benefits.

The club worked hard over the summer to create synergies in training wherever possible, so kids playing multiple games can mostly train with the same squad.

Please also allow your coach to coach! If you have feedback about how they're doing, send it to the club, rather than the team group chat or the coach themselves. You can also speak privately to your Team Manager.
