

The rebuilt Kensington Rec Centre – now known as **Kensington Community Aquatic Recreation Centre**, or KCARC – will re-open in mid-2025. And we're moving in!

With three indoor netball courts, the Centre offers a fantastic opportunity to train many teams in one place on one night, and relief for parents tired of fighting their way through Racecourse Road traffic.



The new Centre is in much demand already, but we've been lucky to secure bookings on Wednesdays and Fridays.

As a result, there will be changes for Spring season – that is, the season after this one, running July to December – as we need to shuffle teams into a new venue and new timeslots.

Look out for our 2025 Spring EOI in the next few months, when we'll be asking families to indicate whether they're planning to play on and what their new training time will be!

Kites Take On 17&U Div 1

The Kensington Kites have qualified for Parkville Tuesday 17&U Division 1 - the first time in club history a team has reached this level. It's a huge accomplishment for players, coaches and club, as they face off elite representative teams and the very best of what club netball has to offer.

Historical Fun Fact: When our club formed in 2013, the Kites were the first team: a group of six and seven year olds from Kensington Primary School. All those players have since grown out of the club – some now play for Kensington Open Netball Club – and the Kites name is given to our top team.

Courtside Conduct: What's OK?

Spectators are bombarded with messages to mind their conduct at community sport. But what does this mean exactly? It may not always be obvious!

Always good:

- Positive encouragement: "Come on, Kensington!" "You can do it!"
- Celebrating effort, skill or cleverness: "Good effort!" "Great defence!"
- Celebrating the process, not just the outcome
- Passionate clapping, cheering, whistling!

Be wary of:

• Loud celebration when you're winning easily – *can be dispiriting for the other*

team

- Coaching might conflict with the coach's instructions
- Highlighting mistakes *kids usually know when they've made an error*
- Encouraging aggressive play can sour the spirit between teams

Never:

- Approach or address an umpire or opposition player *forbidden by league rules*
- Audibly criticise a player, umpire or umpiring decision *forbidden*
- Instruct other people's kids even with the best of intentions, rarely well-received
- Tell a coach what to do *undermining*, *particularly of younger coaches*
- Be disrespectful, intimidating or aggressive

Any grievances must be addressed through proper channels, not in the heat of the moment. You can speak privately to your Team Manager, or contact the club's Complaints Officer.

Team Selection: An Inside Look

Everyone is interested in who gets to be on which team. But for many parents, the process is pretty mysterious!

Around October each year, we start gathering information from:

- **Parents & Players** who submit their preferences for friendships, training days, and preferred playing positions
- **Coaches** who write reports on positions, developmental level, and social factors, plus their own availability
- **Grading Day** performances



We compile all this data into cards like this:

Team Selectors (who are volunteers, of course!) then spend hundreds of hours figuring out effective combinations of players, coaches, training venues, and timeslots.

This process has hundreds of moving parts, where each change has ripples that affect other people. And it goes on for a long time – sometimes teams still require changes up until March.

While many parents would like to know "Why is so-and-so- on that team?", there's rarely a simple answer – it's a combination of who could train when, with which coach, in conjunction with which other suitable players, and much more.

It's an exhausting process, but the club has a strong commitment to delivering effective teams, giving as many kids as possible the best chance to bond, develop and build for success together.
